THE CREATIVE PROCESS

- Innovation is the discovery of a new or unusual idea or product by the application of logic, experience, or artistry. This would inclide the recombination of things or ideas already known.
- A given engineer may or may not be a creative thinker, although all engineers should have mastered the basic techniques of problem solving.
- For problem solving, the engineer must be intelligent, well informed, and discerning, so that he can apply the principles of deductive reasoning to the various innovational alternatives when he encounters them.
- Although creative thinkers must e innovators, it does not follow necessarily that all innovators have to be creative thinkers.
- All persons of normal intelligence possess some ability to think creatively and to engage in imaginative and innovative effort. Unfortunately, the vast majority of people are only partially aware of the range of their creative potential. This potential seldom is attained, even if recognized.
- Methods used in stimulate ideas are:
 - The use of checklists.
 - o Reviewing of properties & alternatives.
 - Systematically searching design parameters.
 - o Brainstorming.
 - Synectics

- Mental attributes the contribute positively towards creative thought are:
 - An inquiring & questioning mind
 - o Ability to concentrate and communicate.
 - o Ability to accept conflict and tension without becoming frustrated.
 - Willingness to consider a new idea even though it may seem to be in conflict with previous experience
- In addition, there are personal qualities frequently associated with creative individuals. Developing them will enhance the likelihood that the individual will express himself creatively. They are as follows:
 - o Intellectual curiosity.
 - o Acute powers of observation.
 - Sensitivity to recognize that a problem exists.
 - o Direct imagination.
 - Initiative.
 - o Originality.
 - Memory.
 - Ability to analyze and synthesize.
 - o Intellectual integrity.
 - Ability to think in analogies and images.
 - o Intuition.
 - o Being articulate in verbal response and alert in mental processes.
 - o Patience, determination, and persistence.
 - o Understanding of the creative process.

THE SEARCH & EVALUATION OF ALTERNATIVES

• Specification:

- The specification is listing by the designer of parameters essential to design.
- Any item or value transferred from the requirement to the specification must be critically examined before the transfer is permitted.
- The specification must be so framed as to avoid unnecessarily influencing the possible range of solutions.
- o An order of priorities within a specification must be recognized.

• Speculation:

- o The two main forms of stimulus applicable to good design are:
 - Human interaction (brainstorming).
 - The pursuit of logical path.

• Evaluation:

- The 1st stage of assessment can be made on the basic of common sense.
- The 2nd stage in the elimination is one of considering technical feasibility.
